Student Safety Warning

There have been several incidents in the local area (in particular at bus stops and on public buses) where different men have brazenly approached young girls inappropriately, making them feel uncomfortable and afraid. The school (and parents) have actively made statements with local police who are investigating each case further. We encourage you to speak with your daughters about how they can respond practically and feel empowered if they were to find themselves in a circumstance like this. We will be reinforcing self-protection strategies at school. We do not want to alarm the girls, but we certainly want them to be alert and aware of how to access help in order to protect themselves (and each other).

Dear Stella Community

Developing Women Leaders

Whilst reading a recent article about the school ties that underpin networks of influence among leaders in Australia, I was struck by the number of women leaders on the list of leaders who were graduates of girls' schools.

Of the thirteen listed women of influence, eleven were graduates of girls' schools. The list included politicians such as Foreign Affairs Minister, Marise Payne (MLC School) and Deputy Opposition Leader Tanya Plibersek (Jannali Girls High). The NSW Governor, Margaret Beazley (St Joseph Girls High School), Clover Moore (Loreto Kirribilli) and Lucy Turnbull (Frensham and Sydney Girls High) were listed as demonstrating leadership through current and previous government roles. Jillian Broadbent (Ravenswood), Shemara Wikramanayake (Ascham) and Ita Buttrose (Dover Heights Girls High) were recognised as leaders in business and the media.

Stella Maris has a strong history of empowering women leaders. We have noted previously that Commander Bernadette Alexander is in charge of HMAS Penguin in Mosman, having had a distinguished career in the Navy. Alumnae Katherine Edney's artwork has most recently been included in the 2019 and 2020 Archibald Prize competition. Rachel Mason Nunn is currently a specialist in social development, gender empowerment and institutional strengthening at Equity Economics and was this year noted on a list of young leaders to watch.

What is it that girls' schools are doing well to form future leaders?

I believe that fostering wellbeing is essential in girls' schools, this then provides an opportunity for girls to explore their own talents and capacities in a supportive environment where collaboration is encouraged and missteps are recognised as opportunites to learn. Working collaboratively and purposefully is something that is fostered at Stella and sets our graduates up well for their post-school destinations.

Stella Maris Staff Retreat Day

Last Friday we held our staff retreat day where Luke Tobin from Catholic Mission led us in a reflection on the Benedictine value of peace. Exploring scripture in the first session was followed by an individual and group quest for peace through walking, weaving, reflection and other activities that provided us all with moments of peace. Finally, the staff came together to celebrate peace in shared reflections and prayer.

Providing a Term's Notice

Local families are reminded that the College requires one term's notice of any move to another school or learning environment (NB overseas enrolments require two terms' notice). Secondly, once school returns in January, we are unlikely to make up numbers lost for any students who choose to leave without providing the required notice.


Comedy Night - Saturday 24 July
