A recent article in *The Conversation* made some suggestions to parents and carers about what might assist students with the return of face-to-face learning.

- It suggests that setting new routines to reestablish structure will assist with getting to school.
- Allowing time to reset is important as students might be tired when first going back to school.
- Acknowledging that it might be difficult or that teens might be anxious about what the first days might be like.
- Showing empathy and helping them to reach out to their friends to support them could be useful.
- Finally, being optimistic about the experience of returning to school is important to assist the transition.

It is worth noting that one of the benefits of an all-girls' environment is that the girls are called to step into all leadership positions without concern for traditional gender roles.

So many of our alumnae are in positions of influence in a broad range of domains - medicine, politics, education, law, the arts, sport, academia and social justice, among others. Experiencing leadership opportunities and witnessing female leadership at school breaks down barriers and creates mindsets for future success. There's no glass ceiling at Stella!

Standing Up for Education for Afghani Girls

An education for all is a basic right and will foster future peace, so Stella students are hitting the keyboards to lobby the government to take stronger action to ensure the right to an education is upheld for girls and women living under Taliban rule in Afghanistan. In the Year Meetings this past week in Year 7, Year 8 and Year 9, the Heads of Year raised this initiative with their groups and gave these younger girls some context about what is happening in Afghanistan.

The idea is to gather and direct student letters to Mr Alex Hawke, Minister for Immigration. As part of our Stella Year of Peace & Justice, we see this as a something we can do to support fellow female students that, in stark contrast to the opportunities available to us here in Australia, are now restricted and controlled under the Taliban.

Ms Metcalfe has provided a template to help our girls construct their own letters. Please encourage your daughters to get writing!

Letters are due to Ms Metcalfe by this Tuesday, 26th October, Period 2 (PC session). JRS (Jesuit Refugee Service) and other Good Sam schools are also gathering student letters to send all together by next Wednesday 27th October.

Calling Volunteers!Christmas Wrapping for Bear Cottage

If you would like to volunteer to wrap Christmas presents at Warringah Mall to raise money for Bear Cottage, contact Ms Metcalfe or Ms Silburn to express your interest **by next Tuesday's** Pastoral Care session Period 2, 26th October.

- The Christmas Wrapping Station will commence on Saturday 4th December and Sunday 5th December (just for the weekend) and then 7 days per week from Saturday 11th December until Friday 24th December (during all shopping hours).
- The shifts are 2 hours at a time, however, it is possible to request longer/double shifts. The students may be able to be rostered together with their friends depending on shift availability.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

This will be provided in a more formalised fashion closer to the time but in the interim, please note the following:

- Depending on the date/times, 3 to 6 volunteers at a time are required.
- There is ample space on the stand for volunteers to be safely socially distanced and masks must/may be worn (depending on NSW Health guidelines at the time). Hand sanitiser will be provided.
- There will be a designated "team leader" on the stand for each shift so that the students are able to receive guidance during their shift if required
- All volunteers must be double vaccinated with proof of vaccination provided prior to volunteering
- Volunteers and customers will be required to check in via the Westfield QR code as per entry requirements to other shops at Warringah Mall
- Bollards and roping will be in place to ensure that customers are able to social distance and form orderly lines



Good Sams Foundation

"On Thursday the 21st some girls from Stella and I got to talk some of the Sisters of the Good Samaritan about the work that the Good Samaritan Foundation supports. We talked to Sisters in Melbourne, Sydney and the Philippines. All of these sisters have different stories and work in very different places.

One Sister works in the Philippines and gets no money from it. She helps at the Kinder School and helps cook in kitchens to make food for the homeless. They teach women how to cook and help them with their personal lives. She also takes food and amenities to women in prison and talks to them. Unfortunately a lot of their work has been put on hold due to the pandemic. Many of the kids have not been able to attend school and they have not been able to enter the prisons. Many people in the Philippines have not been able to get vaccinated either so this means a lot of them are getting Covid and becoming very sick.

We also got to talk to a Sister in Melbourne. She is a family investigator for women and children's domestic violence and works in homes and safe places where women and children can come to escape domestic violence. The location of the home is kept secret and only known to people staying there and people who work there. This is so a partner can't come in and hurt them. We got to learn some facts about domestic violence as well. One of these facts was that one woman every week is murdered by her partner due to domestic violence. This is why the Sisters create places like this, so these things happen less often.

Overall it was a great experience to see the work done all over the world by the Sisters and how it is helping people everywhere.

We saw that when everyone makes small changes we can make big changes to the world around us."



Scholarship 2022 Senior Performing Arts

We are pleased to announce the opportunity for Year 10 students to apply for a Senior Performing Arts Scholarship.

The successful applicant will

- Have a proven ability as an outstanding, active, and committed member of the Performing Arts community at Stella Maris College.
- Select 2-unit Music and/or Dance and/or Drama as part of their HSC pattern of study.
- Be achieving outstanding academic results in all subject areas.
- Reflect and support the Benedictine values of our College.

The Scholarship covers the tuition fee component of the annual student fees for Year 11 2022 and Year 12 2023 and is subject to an annual review of commitment and performance. The Scholarship does not cover the cost of resource fees or any other non-tuition fees.

Please complete this **APPLICATION FORM** if you are interested in applying for the Senior Performing Arts Scholarship.

Applications close 3.00pm 1st November. Auditions held week beginning 15th November.

Once applications are closed, a short list of successful applicants will be invited for an audition. Those successful in the audition will be called for an interview.

With the fluid Covid restrictions at the moment we may require applicants to submit a video of their performance if we are unable to audition in person. Applicants will be informed of the audition process closer to the audition date.

Applicants are to prepare the following for their audition:

- Music an accompanied performance on their principal instrument. Backing tracks or live accompaniment are acceptable.
- Dance a prepared solo in preferred style.
- Drama a short monologue (no longer than 2 minutes).

Feedback from other Stella families using this facility is that the application process is straight forward.





The minimum number of children to attend is 6 with no maximum numbers (up to 50 can be catered for). The price is \$80 per child. The minimum age is 5 years and again no maximum as all ages enjoy the parties and they are designed for the age group booked.

The fun filled 1.5 hours includes the children hand tempering chocolate on marble and making a selection of chocolates – all of which they take home on the day in generous goody bags (so you do not have to create these yourself!). The children make chocolate bars, artwork lollypops, chocolate stars and freckles (this can be adjusted or changed on request).

You can choose to use organic milk, white or dark chocolate. You will need to make the selection before the event. All children get a certificate, celebrating the day. The birthday parties usually are hosted 2-3.30 on Saturdays and Sundays but other days and times can be booked if we have availability.



We offer a full high tea service after your party for an additional \$40pp. Please note our high tea is an outdoor event only.

Alternatively there is a lovely BBQ area that many parents have a party and cake at after. Please note the BBQ area is a public facility, so we recommend you get there early to try to get the space. Our front lawn is an excellent alternative to bring a picnic rug and watch the boats sail by on the harbour foreshore while enjoying your cake.

If you would like our balcony with tables and chairs and plates for the cake; this space can be leased for 1 hour for an additional \$150 per hour. This way you can have full access to our harbourside outdoor deck to celebrate with cake and snacks that you bring on the day.

Please note we are a fully licensed venue, so can serve adults sparkling wine and champagne at this time. For BYO we charge an overall \$25 corkage for the hour. Please advise us if you are bringing alcohol on the day.






