#### Vale Year 12 2021

This week we celebrated with our Year 12 students in Year Meetings to thank them for their contribution to the school and to commend them for their achievements over the past six years.

At the Year Meeting with their Pastoral Care teachers and Ms Bourke, I shared with Year 12 some advice from Julia Baird, in her recent book *Phosphorescence* (2019), where she wrote a chapter to her daughter with some thoughts to consider as she embarks on life as an adult. Julia says

- First demand respect and give it. Sometimes you will feel insane or be told you are but persist.
- Use your brain. You will be praised for your sunny face and kind ways but you also must protect and stretch your fine brain.
- Find friends with true hearts and love them long and loyally. Never take your family for granted, love them unwaveringly. Practice forgiveness on all of them.
- The most important quality to look for in another human is goodness. Don't make the mistake of dismissing decency as dullness.
- You deserve love. Real enduring love. But remember Proverbs 4.23 Above all else guard your heart for it is the wellspring of life.
- Be you. Dare and don't let the world crush your astonishing spirit.
- Know that bad times will pass. Walk tall and don't descend to nastiness and vitriol. As Michelle Obama put it, 'When they go low, we go high'.
- Walk lightly on the earth. Be at peace with God. Never mock another person's beliefs. Allow yourself and others to make mistakes.
- Know that being a woman is magnificent. Your elders and ancestors give you an authority. Of being strong and certain and bold. Of being able to create and nurture life.
- Shrug off anyone who would tell you to be less than you are.

I would add one more thought: always remember that you are amazing, you are God's work of art (Ephesians 2:10) and your future will be formed by the communities you touch, the people you listen to and dreams you dare to dream. We want you to fulfil your potential as future leaders. Go out and make a positive difference in the world - we know you can do it.

We wish the Class of 2021 well with their upcoming examinations and for their future lives starting in 2022.

## **Visual Arts Finalists**

We are excited to have two of our Visual Arts students exhibiting as finalists in the Northern Beaches Environmental Art & Design Prize 2021 this year. The exhibition was postponed due to Covid, but, happily, the galleries are going ahead with an exhibition starting next week.

Riley Hughton (Year 9) painted a series of three acrylic paintings titled 'Ocean Oasis' and Katie Cooper (Year 10) is exhibiting a black and white photographic work titled 'Wrangling Reforestation'.

This year there are over 220 finalists across nine categories whose works shine a light on renewal, regeneration and our shared human experience in the world.

Computational Biology is a combination of mathematics, statistics, computer science, and biology. Computational Biologists are responsible for gathering data, then using this data to create models to interpret biological phenomena. They can use this data for a number of purposes; to find patterns and trends, understand how things evolve and change, and even cure diseases.

Examples of projects real Computational Biologists are working on include finding a cure for cancer, helping to stop the spread of deadly diseases like Ebola, and helping develop more sustainable fishing practices



The minimum number of children to attend is 6 with no maximum numbers (up to 50 can be catered for). The price is \$80 per child. The minimum age is 5 years and again no maximum as all ages enjoy the parties and they are designed for the age group booked.

The fun filled 1.5 hours includes the children hand tempering chocolate on marble and making a selection of chocolates – all of which they take home on the day in generous goody bags (so you do not have to create these yourself!). The children make chocolate bars, artwork lollypops, chocolate stars and freckles (this can be adjusted or changed on request).






