Congratulations Stella Graduates of 2021

Last week you would have received a letter regarding the achievement of the Class of 2021 at Stella Maris

College. Stella was ranked 16th among NSW Catholic girls's schools and 96th overall.

As a school, we were immensely proud of the girls, whose academic study over the past two years was impacted by the pandemic. It was impressive that 43% of the cohort scored at least one Band 6 result and 92% of all our HSC marks were over 70/100.

Well done to the Class of 2021 and to all the staff and Stella families who supported them on their iournev from Year 7 to Year 12!

Helping teachers and students reset for 2022

A recent article in Teacher Magazine by Dr Tom Brunzell - Director of Education at Berry Street, gave advice that now is not the time for teachers and students to rush in with an effort to 'catch up' on their learning 'because the academic outcomes won't flow unless everyone is ready to teach and ready to learn'.

We first need to recognise the stress we have been under over the past two years and work to relieve the pressure. For each person the approach might be different but we all know what works for us - walking, exercise, music or even meditation.

Secondly, we should identify what is happening to us and find time to breathe and get our focus back on track.

For students it is crucial to re-establish the rhythms of the community. For teachers there needs to be a focus on creating inclusive classrooms where every student feels welcome and known.

Students may be nervous about engaging again in their learning face-to-face. We need to send the message that it is okay to make mistakes as that is part of the journey. We should encourage the development of resilience and assist with strategies to help them get organised and on track.

College Fees

A friendly reminder that the preferred payment method for school fees is via a Direct Debit Arrangement.

Please note that Monthly and Quarterly instalments are only available under a Direct Debit Arrangement.

If you had a Direct Debit Arrangment in 2021, this will automatically be continued for 2022. Your instalments will be adjusted and commence 15 February 2022.

If you do not have a Direct Debit Arrangement in place, payment of the account must be paid in three equal installments.

One third of the total invoice will be due:

- 15 February 2022
- 15 May 2022
- 15 August 2022

Family Discount

Payment of the full invoice by 15 February will attract a \$250 discount per student with a maximum of \$500 discount per family. This discount applies only where the fees for all siblings are paid in full by 15 February.

At present lunch orders **must be ordered online.** Unfortunately we are unable to accept orders sent via email or over the telephone.

We ask that all online orders be placed no later than **8:00am each day.**

We ask you not place orders for more than 24 hours in advance as there are occassions where stock may have been consumed and no longer available.

Please ensure your daughter has available funds on her Student Account. Insufficient funds will result in the order not being processed.

Currently we are able to sell drinks, snacks and ice-creams from outside the canteen after lunch orders have been given out. We are not allowing walk-ins during Recess or Lunch at this time.

If you daughter has special dietary requirements, please notify us so we can make every effort to accommodate her needs.

Any prescripton or over-thecounter medication held onsite must be in-date.


You may be contacted to replace any expired, or soon to be expired medication(s).

Absences

We remind our parent/guardian community to notify of student absences by 8:00am or earlier where possible.

Advise the name of your daughter, reason for absence and expected return date.

In this current COVID-19 climate, some medical absences may require further explanation of symptoms.

This will enable our Student Services Team to notify class teachers of her absence and maintain accurate records.

Early Exit

We understand there are times students need to leave before the official end of the school day.

We require parents to notify Student Services.

The student will need to obtain a Leave Pass to present to their teacher to leave their lesson.

Before exiting the grounds, the student must officially check-out at Student Services.

Lost Property

We often have school jerseys, jackets, scarfs, wireless devices and other items handed to Lost Property. Many items cannot be returned to the student as they are unlabelled.

We ask items be labelled so they can be returned to the student.

Late Arrivals

Where students arrive late for school, the student is required to visit
Student Services to explain reason for late arrival.
Parents may be contacted for verificaiton purposes.

Kiss and Drop Zone

A reminder students can be dropped or collected from school at the designated Kiss & Drop Zone located in Iluka Avenue. Please park responsibly and avoid obstructing neighbouring driveways.

P Plate Drivers
