From the Principal

Friendships

This week at Assembly we celebrated friendships. Paris, our School Captain, shared some great ways in which we can foster good friendships with our peers. I spoke to the girls about some specific things they might be able to do to repair relationships when things go wrong.

Dealing with Strong Minded Friends: Sometimes a strong person in a friendship group tries to control the conversation, the agenda and even what you do together as a group. Sometimes we refer to these people as a Queen Bee.

Try to develop your own self-confidence and cultivate broad friendships beyond your core group of friends. As your own confidence grows you might gently suggest that your view is a little different, but that you accept that their point of view is valid.

Jealousy: Sometimes a friend might be a little jealous of you or you of them. Perhaps there is some competitiveness or difference that fuels this in your mind.

Remember to accept your friend for who they are. If they are better at some things, be happy for them. Instead of investing in negative feelings be positive and maybe be motivated to develop your skills.

Betrayal: Has a friend ever broken a promise to you? It can be very hurtful and damage relationships. Remember it is important to keep your promises unless you are concerned about your friend's wellbeing and need to seek help for them.

Differences: Sometimes you and your friend can have dissimilar interests. This might lead to some estrangement but it doesn't have to be all bad. The fact you have diverse interests can be healthy and lead to other pockets of friendship for both of you.

Conflict: Sometimes an argument can create issues in friendships and some friends have long memories of such arguments.

Try to restore friendships as soon as possible and be willing to accept that you may have acted rashly or hurt them. Reach out to them in friendship, perhaps do something to make up for the conflict if it is possible.

Remember that friendships are powerful. Friends that you make at Stella often become lifelong. Friendships are special. Invest in them.

Best wishes to our Year 12 students for their Trial HSC Exams which run from August 1 - 15. Students will return to regular classses on Monday 15 August (except for Extension History students who still have an exam on that Monday).

Students are expected to be in full school uniform when attending their exams.

Following the Trial HSC Exams, we have organised a Study Skills Workshop on Monday 29 August for Year 12 students with Dr Prue Salter (www.enhanced-learning.net). The session will help reinvigorate Year 12 students to compile a study plan right through to their final HSC exams so they can be confident about their approach in the last months of their studies. Dr Salter will outline the steps students should take to apply teacher feedback, fine-tune their study approach and bring balance to their studies with self-care. Using research about the brain, students will be guided in how to structure their study during the HSC exam period and avoid common study mistakes. Students will have the chance to map out their exam timetable and allocate study time based on the guidelines Dr Salter explains, looking at different scenarios such as exams that are clustered together or significant gaps in the exam timetable. Parents are encouraged to ask their student to explain their plan to them after the session as talking through it will help embed the learning from the session and give parents a greater understanding of what our students will be undertaking in their last weeks of Year 12.

Some feedback from students who have done this session:

"This session helped me to simplify what I need to do and how I can effectively do it."

"The session definitely reinvigorated me - gave some great ideas about study partners, etc. - whilst also not being overly stressful or overwhelming."

"I found Prue very helpful. I'm usually quite individual in terms of my study habits but I'll definitely

Year 12 Trial HSC Exams - Illness Protocols

Year 12 Trial HSC Exams start Monday 1 August and will be held at our Benedict Campus. For Year 12 students who cannot make their exams due to illness the following applies:

Illness - non-COVID-19 related

Notify Ms Heraghty – Head of Year 12 before 8:30am. A **Doctor's Certificate** will be required to confirm illness. If the student is unable to get an appointment with your family doctor or medical centre, a telehealth appointment should be able to provide you with a certificate. Please send a copy of the certificate to Ms Heraghty – Head of Year 12 as soon as possible.

Illness - symptoms associated with COVID-19

Notify Ms Heraghty – Head of Year 12 before 8:30am. The student is to conduct a RAHT test. If result is positive, the student is required to have a PCR test. The text confirmation of a positive PCR result must be sent to Ms Heraghty as soon as possible.

If arriving late to school, all students are required to first sign-in at Student Services prior to proceeding to their timetabled class.




