### The Light We Carry

In her recent book, The Light We Carry (2022), Michelle Obama explains a Native American method of growing food in a resourceful way. She explains that corn, beans and squash are grown together. "The corn grows tall and creates a natural pole for the bean plants to climb. The beans provide nitrogen, a nutrient that helps the other plants grow more efficiently, and the squash stay slow to the ground, its large, spreading leaves help to block weeds and keep the soil moist.....The balance comes from the combination."

In 2023 the Stella Dance Program will offer three levels of opportunity to cater for all students with differing levels of ability and commitment:

#### The Stella Dance Company (Years 7-12)

For the advanced, experienced and dedicated Dancer. Rehearsals one morning a week for each style before school (some Sundays may be required for external choreographers). Routines in Jazz, Commercial Jazz and Lyrical/Contemporary. Approximately three to five Eisteddfod Competitions, two Dance Nights (concerts at school), Dance Camp Day, and Presentation Night performances.



#### **Dance Ensemble** (Years 7-10)

For intermediate dancers with previous experience who want to compete but with less time and commitment than the Dance Company. Rehearsals are held one morning a week before school for each style. Routines in either Jazz/Musical Theatre and Lyrical/Contemporary. Three to five Eisteddfod Competitions and two Dance Nights (concerts at school).

#### **Performance Groups** (Years 7-10)

A semesterly program for the beginner - intermediate dancer who may or may not have previous experience and wants to dance for fun with friends. Rehearsals are held one lunchtime per week. One routine per semester in either Jazz/Musical Theatre or Lyrical/Contemporary.

This group will work towards Dance Night (concerts at school) performances in Terms 2 & 4 and will not compete at Eisteddfods. Students may join in Semester 1 or Semester 2 or participate the entire year. There is no audition required for the Performance group, anyone is welcome!

Please note: There is a cost involved for all dance groups

#### **Auditions**

#### What do I wear?

For Company auditions dancewear is required – leggings or shorts with a crop top, leotard and singlet or t shirt. For Ensemble Auditions you may wear dancewear or your sport uniform.

#### What will happen at the audition?

Students will be taught a short combo which they will then be asked to perform in small groups. If time allows they may also be taken through some corner technique (turns, kicks and leaps).

#### **Australian Athletics Champions!**

On Monday 12 December, the Stella Junior Athletics team travelled to

Adelaide to compete at the 2022 Australian Athletics National Schools Challenge. This is an elite and highly competitive event, with the best athletics schools from across Australia participating.

The Stella team consisted of six students from Years 7, 8 and 9:

Zoe B, Matilda B, Elisabeth P, Pip Q, Ellie E and Lyla R. All of the Stella girls competed amazingly! Every one of our athletes finished in the top five of their events, which is an incredible achievement at such a high level! With such amazing results in each event, the Stella team finished in FIRST PLACE!

Congratulations to this talented group of athletes who are now AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONS! Everyone at Stella is very proud of you!

A big congratulations to Elisabeth P and Pip Q who also competed as individuals, representing NSW at the Australian All Schools Athletics Championships in December. Elisabeth competed in the 14 years shot put and finished in 4th place. Pip competed in the 13 years 800m, 1500m and 14 years 3000m, finishing 5th in all events. Well done Elisabeth and Pip!

#### **NSWCCC Blues Awards**

The NSWCCC Blues awards ceremony took place in early December. The Blues Award is a very prestigious award that is presented to the best performing athletes in NSWCCC sport each year. In 2022, Stella Maris had two students receive these awards!

Philippa Q: Pip was the youngest student to be awarded a NSWCCC Blue award last year. Pip received her award for her outstanding performance in Cross Country. In 2022, Pip was unbeaten in every cross country race, winning the gold medal at Stella, BBSSSA, IGSA, NSWCCC, NSW All Schools and Australian All Schools. This is an amazing achievement and we congratulate Pip on her Blue Award.

Piper S: Piper was awarded the NSWCCC BAR Award for her achievements in Rugby. Piper received a Blue Award for rugby in 2021, and a BAR award in 2022. Piper had an outstanding year in both Rugby 7s and Rugby League in 2022. Piper was selected to represent NSWCCC, NSW All Schools and Australia in both codes. Piper has travelled with the Australian team on many occasions, representing Australia in many international tournaments at a schoolgirl level and open women's level.

At the NSWCCC Blue Awards, Piper was also awarded the prestigious Vince Villa Award, which is presented to the most outstanding athlete in NSWCCC sports. Congratulations Piper on this amazing achievement!

#### **Representative Sport Pathway Levels**

NSWCCC: New South Wales Combined Catholic Colleges: <a href="https://csnsw.sport/">https://csnsw.sport/</a> is the pathway for Stella students to compete at NSW All Schools level and beyond. This is the next level after the Broken Bay Secondary Schools Championships (BBSSSC).

BBSSSA: Stella will compete in all BBSSSA sporting events in the pathway through to NSWCCC Sports. All Broken Bay affiliated schools have access to the following NSWCCC sporting pathways:

Australian Football, Athletics, Basketball, Cricket, Cross Country, Diving, Football (Soccer), Golf, Hockey, Netball, Rugby League, Rugby Sevens, Softball, Swimming, Tennis, Touch, Triathlon, Volleyball, Water Polo

1. These sports are offered through the following structures:

Broken Bay Teams (selected at a trial or Championship Day):

Athletics, Basketball, Cross Country, Football (Soccer), Netball, Rugby League (Boys U15 and Opens / Girls U16/U18), Swimming, Tennis, Touch

2. Individual entry via a nomination on the Catholic Schools NSW Sport website: AFL, Baseball, Cricket, Diving, Golf, Hockey, Rugby Sevens, Rugby Union, Boys and Girls Softball, Triathlon, Volleyball, Water Polo.

Note these are state level trials and as such students should have a strong playing history. There are age restrictions as to who may trial for some teams.
