The new addition of Kerstin Thompson and Associates designed 'Bridge' was stunning to visit, as well as the new subterranean Art Museum embedded in the landscape.


If you get a chance to visit Bundanon you will not regret the experience. It's certainly breathtaking. Open to the public Wednesdays to Sundays.

Next Tuesday 4 April, Year 11 Drama students will be performing the play 'FUGEE' by Abi Morgan at 6.00pm in The Star of the Sea Theatre as part of their Term 1 Drama Assessment. Friends, students and family are welcome to attend this free performance.

'FUGEE', by multi-award winning writer Abi Morgan, explores the world of migrants seeking refuge. FUGEE is a brilliant exploration of what it's like to be a young person finding their way in a new country and negotiating a system that seems firmly rigged against them. It is a compelling tale of friendship, loyalty and young love, framed beautifully around a tragic life changing incident.

Abi Morgan is one of the most interesting voices writing today. She has written extensively for theatre, working at London's Royal Court Theatre on numerous occasions and winning an Olivier Award as most promising playwright. Her screenplay 'The Iron Lady' was an enlightening glimpse into Thatcher, and the woman behind the facade (depicted by the mighty Meryl Streep), and established her as one of the most dynamic writers of today.
