Feast of Mary Star of the Sea

Mary, Star of the Sea, is patron saint of those who make a living by or on the sea, as she is the calmer of storms and a guiding light. Since ancient times, sailors relied on key stars to help them navigate where they were going. During the Middle Ages, the North Star was called "Stella Maris" and sailors relied on the North Star to lead them, as it stays fixed in the same location throughout the night. Similarly, Mary remains firm in heaven helping to guide souls and offering her protection.



St. Bernard of Clairvaux wrote,

"If the winds of temptation arise; If you are driven upon the rocks of tribulation look to the star, call on Mary; If you are tossed upon the waves of pride, of ambition, of envy, of rivalry, look to the star, call on Mary. Should anger, or avarice.....violently assail the frail vessel of your soul, look at the star, call upon Mary."

Mary is our guiding star and reflecting on her may help us calm the storms in our own lives. Just as sailors in the Middle Ages did not have access to a navigation system that could lead them to safety during their travels, we do not have access to a map that will lead us straight to God. However, we can always call upon Mary to guide us.

Throughout the centuries and into the modern day, devotion to Mary as Star of the Sea has led to many churches, schools, lighthouses, and colleges using the name "Stella Maris". Many hymns and prayers emerged during the Middle Ages, such as the beautiful Gregorian chants Ave Maris Stella (which we sing when we gather for Mass) and Alma Redemptoris Mater.

I was a member of the congregation at the Cathedral this week as Bishop Anthony celebrated the Feast of Mary Star of the Sea, patron of our Broken Bay Diocese. Bishop Anthony spoke of Mary being the guiding light in our lives and the strength we can draw from her example of courage and commitment.

This year, Stella will introduce the Hildegard Award. The Award is inspired by Hildegard of Bingen, Germany, one of only four women named a doctor of the church. She was an active writer, composer, philosopher, mystic, visionary, medical writer and practitioner during the Middle Ages and is widely considered by scholars to be the founder of scientific natural history in Germany.

The Award is open to students in Years 7 - 11 with nominations due early Term 4. The Hildegard Award is for a Stella student whose idea will make a difference in:

- Any other field of endeavour inspired by the student's involvement at school.

Visit to Manly Adolescent & Young Adult Hospice

Stella staff were privileged to attend the open day of the new Manly Adolescent and Young Adult Hospice last week. They were delighted to learn that their tour guide was an ex-Stella student - Lucie Appleby, Class of 2009 (pictured with Principal, Elizabeth Carnegie). Lucie is the Clinical Nurse Specialist at the Hospice. As well as completing a Bachelor of Arts degree, Lucie also holds a Masters of Nursing and has almost completed her second Masters of Nursing degree (Oncology and Haematology).

Amongst the beautiful artworks on display at the Hospice were two pieces donated by Stella students. Our thanks to Isabella C for her photography piece, 'A collage of clouds' and Audrey R for her sculpture, 'Finding peace in grief'.

The Hospice is Australia's first dedicated service for young people aged 15 to 24 with life-limiting illness, offering respite care, symptom management, end-of-life care, and care coordination support in the transition from children's to adult services.



Balancing Bytes and Bites

Our Head of Years (HOYs) came across this article on the website, '[Safe on Social](#)' and thought it worthy of sharing. Does this scenario sound familiar?

In the heart of Sydney, a mother, and daughter sit down to enjoy breakfast together at the table next to me. It's Saturday morning. The mother attempts to strike up a conversation, and her teenage daughter, around 14 years old, is intermittently engaging but predominantly engrossed in her smartphone. They mirror our shared struggle to navigate the online world mindfully. There is no escaping the presence of devices.



The article not only provides some great advice for negotiating time away from devices to be present in the moment, but also suggests that devices can 'be enriching rather than distracting when used intentionally and mindfully.'



It's that time of year again, dance competitions have begun! Competitions started earlier than usual this year, so ready or not, in true performing arts style, the show must, and go on it did!

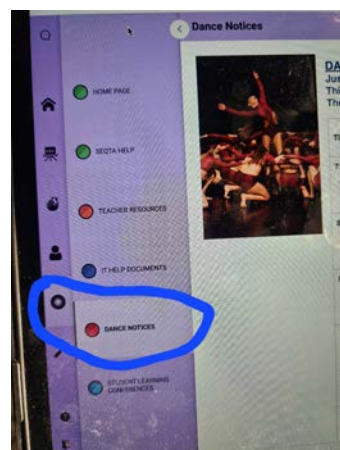

If your daughter is unable to attend for any reason, please let me know as soon as possible.

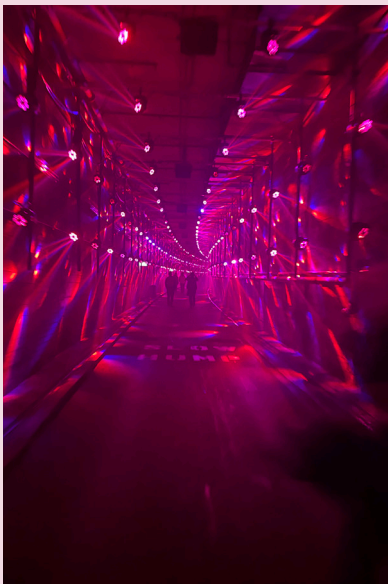
Entertainment News

We also ventured into the depths of the city and walked the unused train tunnels in Vivid called 'Dark Spectrum'.

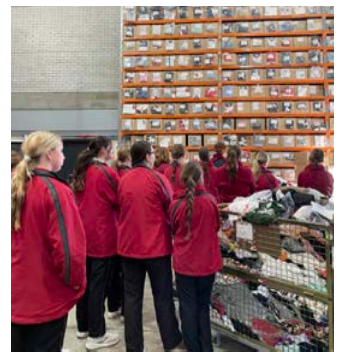
The excursion was extremely valuable in inspiring and informing students of career options in the entertainment industry, especially in the environment of theatre.



Food Technology and Textiles News

On Tuesday, Years 9 and 10 100hr Textiles Technology students went on an excursion to visit *Thread Together* in Banksmeadow. *Thread Together* is a not-for-profit organisation that addresses the uncomfortable truth by saving new clothing from going into landfill and providing these clothes to people in need. They believe circumstances and disadvantage should not prevent people from accessing clothing to allow them to realise their full potential. The students volunteered their time by sorting through large clothing crates and sizing them correctly for *Thread Together* to put into the warehouse storage before being given to those in need e.g domestic violence survivors and the homeless. The students were engaged in the activity and learnt a lot about new clothing being put to landfill.



PDHPE News

This term as part of their PDHPE program, Year 8 are involved in self-defence lessons. They are learning Taekwondo and Ju-Jitsu skills. These lessons are aimed at providing the girls with a range of practical skills that improve their ability to effectively resist unsafe or threatening behaviour. The skills taught are tailored to the student's ability and age and focus on physical and non-physical components designed to empower our students and make them feel confident. The lessons focus on reading body language as well as conflict resolution and self-protection strategies, resolution and exit strategies. There are also the benefits of improvements in posture, strength and co-ordination. Our thanks to Wyllie Taekwondo and Gracie Barra Ju-Jitsu for running the lessons.

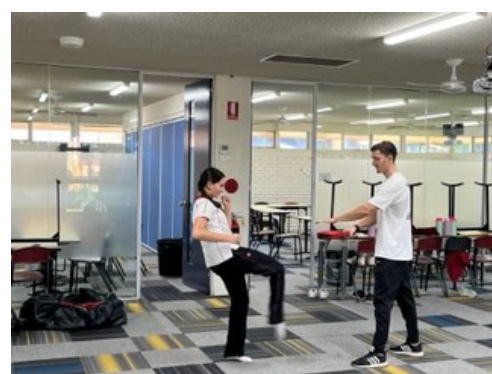

If your daughter goes home sick and has an order, please email us so we know not to look for her. We will refund the amount back to her account.

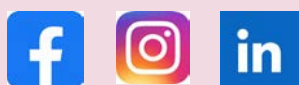
Cake Stall Containers from Stella Day / Lost Property

STEP 3

Click on 'Order Photos' and complete your details and procedures. During this process you can place orders for additional children at your school and sibling photos, if available



cash/envelope ordering

Your school prefers orders to be placed online. However, if you are unable to order online, please complete your order using the order envelope which your daughter can collect from Student Services.

STEP 1

Complete a separate order envelope for each individual child's package/s ordered. If ordering for more than one child, payment should be enclosed in the envelope of the eldest child and this should be indicated on the envelope of the other child/children (the envelope that does not have cash enclosed).

STEP 2

Enclose exact cash payment in one envelope for the package/s you are ordering. Payment for more than one child should be in the eldest child's envelope and marked at the bottom of the envelope in the space provided.

STEP 3

Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on the day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

School photographs will be returned approximately 6 weeks after the day of photography.
Please note this delivery timeframe is dependant on proofing and additional photography days at your school.

IMPORTANT - "not for publication" students

If you have instructed your school that your child's image is "not for publication" (sometimes called "do not publish" or "not for media release" instructions), the school will ensure that your child is not presented to our photographers on photo day and school photographs will not be available for purchase. If you wish to change your instruction, then you must notify your school, so they change their records and identify your child as able to be photographed for school photography purposes. All students presented to our photographers by your school on photo day will be photographed, their images will appear in school photography packages with their fellow students and these packages will be available to purchase by all families.
